

## Citizen involvement in decision making 2025: open government and e-participation

### May 31-June 1, 2016 Tallinn, Estonia

Citizens want a more transparent, effective and accountable government with institutions that empower people and are responsive to their aspirations. The process of Open Government Partnership (OGP) aims to secure concrete commitments from governments to promote transparency and accountability, empower citizens, fight corruption and harness new technologies to strengthen governance.

By being part of this process, participants of the Tallinn workshop will learn more about why OGP wants to work with subnational governments and what they will get out of being part of this network. This will also be a great opportunity for participants from the EU, EU EaP, Russia and Central Asia to provide questions and feedback to various countries where many interesting ideas and innovations are taking place. The event provides an opportunity for civil society organizations to be part of a broader network and continue a cooperation which was started at the Tallinn OGP workshop last year.

The workshop is looking to create a more dynamic and collaborative agenda by experimenting with sessions that are more participatory and characterized by exchanges among the participants, as well as having sessions in which the attendees' capacity can be strengthened in e-participation and other areas of issues.

On the first day of the workshop, the state of the OGP will be discussed – what OGP has achieved since its inception in 2011, what have been the key takeaways from the cooperation between governments and civil society, which tools have worked on opening up governments and which have not.

The second day will be dedicated to citizen participation via technology and innovation. The participants will discuss and debate how citizens engage in public debate, provide input, and make contributions that lead to more responsive and effective governance.

Around 50 participants - civic activists, IT- and democracy visionaries, public officials, foundations from Estonia, Latvia, Finland, EU Eastern Partnership countries, Russia and Central Asian countries will attend.
